**Have = you (or they)**

Question: **Have** you finished your homework **yet**?

**I have (or They have)**

- Answer: I **have just** finished my homework.
- Answer: I **have already** finished my homework.
- Answer: I **have** not finished my homework **yet**.



**Has = she (or he)**

Question: **Has** she finished her homework **yet**?

**She has (or He has)**

- Answer: She **has just** finished her homework.
- Answer: She **has already** finished her homework.
- Answer: She **has** not finished her homework **yet**.

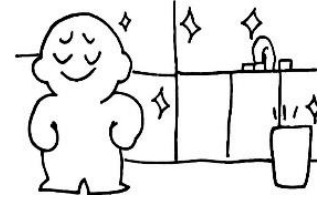

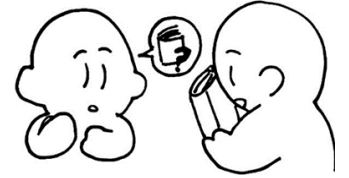

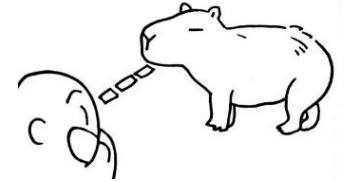
